Discussion questions to encourage critical thinking.



These questions and any others you can think of can be discussed after reading the story together. Don't ask them all at once.

The experience of reading is supposed to be enjoyable and not an inquisition.

Many questions can be asked as you are reading the story or before you turn to a new page ask, what do you think will happen next?

The answers I have provided are a guide only and I have not addressed all issues otherwise we could have a new novel on our hands.

Your child may think up some amazing responses, reasons and opinions.

Encourage unusual, creative or original ideas.

Which of the trainee knights did you like the most? Why?

Do you think the tradition of knights saving a princess from a dragon should continue? Why?

What are some of the possible problems of continuing?

Dragons and knights continuing to be killed.

Princesses tied up for long periods in the cold and rain. Not willing to participate.

Run out of dragons

Dragons flatly refusing to take part.

What other ways do you think trainee knights could become fully-fledged knights?

Jousting competitions.

A special task to fulfil.

Bravery in battle.

Great chef in the kitchen....just joking.

Do you think Sir Quentin Quite-Teapotty (page 54) will ever become a fully-fledged knight? Why?

Why?


Creative activities & Imagination Boosters

Make your own trainee knight. See the drawing guide.




Draw your own princess and make up excuses why she cannot possibly be tied to a pole. (See pages 71 – 73)




